1) *Your Desired Travel Months - March/April - (Fall = March to June)*

Best Options for Weather!

Brazil - High Season is November to April

Bolivia - Visiting the Rain Forest & Lowlands is best during April - Oct.

Chile - Southern Chile, Easter Island, Juan Fernández is best in March . High Season is October - April.

Colombia - Dry season runs from December to March.

Guyana - Best time to visit is October - May

Uruguay - Best time to visit is October to May

Venezuela - Best time to visit is December to April

2) *Your Desired Vacation Type - Adventure Vacation*

Brazil - Home to the largest rain forest on the planet, one of the biggest river systems, and the top river by volume. *Rio*- With its famous beaches, you can surf, play volleyball soccer-style, or just lay back . Close by you can also enjoy a range of hiking trails and superb launchpads for hang gliders. *The Amazon River* - Is the main highway of a wet zone fed by a mayhem of tributaries. To get here you have to travel by water without getting trapped on it. Most cruise ships leave you

straining to glimpse clumps of trees on distant shores, but the better outfitters will take you upstream on riverboats to where the real exploring begins—jungle treks, wildlife tracking, nighttime caiman-spotting, and fishing for piranha. **Marsh Madness** - The Pantanal is more than 17 times the size of Florida's Everglades National Park. The world's biggest jaguars roam here, as do giant anteaters, river otters, & capybaras. More than 400 avian species, from fluorescent blue-and-yellow macaws to jabiru storks, make this a birding Valhalla. Out of Bonito, you can snorkel crystalline natural-spring rivers loaded with tropical fish, paddle the flow, and shower in warm waterfalls. **Shore Party** - The northeastern state of Bahia is the historic heartland of the country and of Afro-Brazilian culture. Poor but vibrant, the area is a hotbed of musical hybrids as well as a growing number of waterfront activities. You can sail, surf, ride a Jet Ski, or bask on idyllic horde-free beaches from Natal all the way to Maceió.

Bolivia - Climb to the top of South America for an out-of-this-world Bolivian experience— encounter awe-inspiring geography, cities rich in colonial history and indigenous culture. From **La Paz**, the highest capital city in the world, travel to the crest of the **Andes** and the middle of nowhere for three days of incredible off-road exploration of the **Uyuni Salt Flats** and surrounding desert altiplano. Take the road less travelled and meet locals for an immersive cultural experience that few travelers get to know. If you are looking for an authentic experience away from the tourist track, Bolivia is the perfect place for genuine adventure.

Highlights: Exploring the winding streets and markets of La Paz, experiencing the Uyuni Salt Flats and high mountain wilderness by 4x4, discovering colonial cities and historic cultures in Bolivia.

Chile - **The Atacama Desert** is the highest and Driest Desert in the world. Unique rock formations will leave you speechless the entire time you are there; valle de la luna (moon valley), death valley, and dinosaur valley, to name a few. **Easter**

Island is one of the most isolated places on Earth, the lineage of the people in Easter Island is actually traced back to Polynesia and Micronesia, not the migration originally thought. The island is famous for its 887 extant monumental statues, called moai, created by the early Rapanui people centuries ago. It's very easy to get around on the island and some tourists like to bike around the island. *Patagonia* in Chile is where you will see gorgeous snow-capped mountains where the Andes tower over the border of Chile and Argentina. *Santiago* is home to a great nightlife in an area called Bellavista, extremely interesting museums to visit, and even wine country nearby. The La Vega market in the center of the city is a must see! Located within the Laguna San Rafael National Park, the *San Rafael Glacier* is a giant glacier that calves into the Laguna San Rafael. The glacier is accessible only by boat or plane. The journey by boat is a spectacle in itself, passing through the narrow channels of the isolated Aisén region. *Torres del Paine* is a national park in the Extreme South region of Patagonian Chile and features mountains, lakes and glaciers. *Pucón* is a small touristy town in the middle of the southern Lake District. The unrivaled location by a beautiful lake and imposing volcano makes it one of the most popular tourist attractions in Chile.

Colombia - *Cartagena* - colonial charm, colorful culture and picturesque coastal setting has made it Colombia's number 1 travel destination for decades. Cartagena certainly has something for everyone. *Bogotá* - In Bogotá you can check out the famous gold museum containing pre-Columbian art, as well as the biggest collection of Botero artwork in the world. *The Coffee Triangle* - Colombia is the most famous coffee producer in the world and in the Colombian Coffee Triangle coffee is not just a hot drink but a culture and livelihood.

Tayrona National Park and the Lost City - Chances are that if you've heard anything about Colombia you've heard something about Tayrona National Park and the Lost City. Tumbling down from the tallest coastal mountain range on the

planet, this 15,000 hectare park is bursting with tropical wildlife and archaeological treasures. Apart from scuba diving, wildlife observation and relaxing on the beach, Tayrona National Park is the leaving point for Colombia's most famous hike, a 5 day jungle trek to the Lost City, dubbed 'the new Machu Pichu'. **The Amazon** - This jungle literally palpitates with life, and here you can do some of the best wildlife observation tours on the planet, to see everything from pink dolphins, anacondas, jaguars and over 1500 different bird species. **San Andres and Providencia Islands** - If it's paradise islands, coral reefs and piña coladas that you're after, there's no better place than San Andres and Providencia Islands.

Medellin - Medellin's delightful year-round climate has awarded it the name 'The city of eternal spring' and it's a great city to spend a few days. Popular activities include a controversial Pablo Escobar tour, a cable car ride to the top of the surrounding mountain and a night out with who are often regarded the most beautiful women in the world. **San Gil** - San Gil is the adventure sport capital of Colombia and one of the best places in the world to get your adrenaline pumping. In this breathtaking, dry and mountainous landscape you can go white water rafting, paragliding, caving, canyoning, abseiling, bungee jumping, kayaking and a whole lot more! **Gorgona Island** - Gorgona Island is known for its abundant wildlife. Once the Alcatraz of South America, what's left of the maximum security prison has long been overrun by capuchin monkeys, venomous snakes and fluorescent blue lizards. In the waters surrounding this eco-paradise are endangered sea turtles, manta rays, hammerhead sharks and humpback whales.

Guyana - There are several waterfalls in Guyana, spread across different regions. Most of them are in **Potaro-Siparuni** while others are in Cuyuni-Mazaruni and Mazuni-Potaro. Each waterfall has characteristic features. Of the nine waterfalls in Guyana, Kaieteur is the most popular. **Ayanganna** mountain is one of the most impressive nature spots in Guyana. Ayanganna is a tepui, a high

plateau with steep borders. **Iwokrama Forest** is one of the few remaining unspoiled forests on earth. It has more than 420 species of fish and 90 kinds of bats. **The Eastern Kanuku Mountains** has forests already explored by man but because it has the greatest diversity of bats in a region, it deserves to be one of the top tourist attractions in Guyana.

Venezuela - **Caracas** is the capital of Venezuela and is a bustling city of nearly 5 million residents. Speedy, progressive and multi-ethnic, the city offers a good range of museums, excellent restaurants and nightlife. **The Cathedral**, the Government Palace and City Hall is located on the side of the square. **Margarita Island** of vast stretches of coastline. Margarita Island is part of the Caribbean islands which lie to the east of the capital Caracas. If you want to see lots of wildlife and see the sights of rural Venezuela, just go to **Los Llanos**! Also, **Canaïma National Park** has an area of 30,000 square kilometers and is located in southeastern Venezuela that borders Brazil and Guyana, precisely in the state of Bolívar. In **Morrocoy**, tourists can see the blue waters of the coral in the middle of the beach combined with beautiful scenery and wildlife that live around it. This place is perfect for nature lovers. Don't miss **Angel Falls**, the tallest waterfall in the world with a height of 1002 meters. This waterfall is located in the Canaïma National Park, Bolívar. The waterfall is 19 times higher than Niagara Falls!! Save Travels!!
